

MULLIGAN CONCEPT TEACHERS ASSOCIATION TEACHER ACCREDITATION INFORMATION

The Mulligan Concept Teacher's Association (MCTA) is a group of physical therapists (physiotherapists) who are accredited to teach the Mulligan Concept. Currently, there are over 50 accredited teachers internationally. All MCTA teachers have post graduate credentials in manipulative/manual therapy up to a standard set by [IFOMT](#). MCTA teachers have obtained mentorship in the Mulligan Concept and have passed the credentialing examination process.

The goals of the MCTA are:

- To educate clinicians world wide in the Mulligan Concept.
- To develop and accredit future teachers of the Mulligan Concept
- To ensure teachers and teaching are of a high caliber.
- To promote research into Mulligan Concept techniques.

The process of becoming accredited as a teacher and member of the MCTA is as follows:

1. Teacher applicant qualifications (must possess all below):

- The individual must have a minimum of 5 years of relevant clinical experience.
- Be a fully qualified Fellow of an IFOMPT Member organisation (a person qualifying from an IFOMPT accredited manual therapy programme in a Member Organisation country)
- Be a Certified Mulligan Practitioner. CMPs are expected to maintain the highest ethical professional conduct and promote and support the mission of the International Mulligan Concept Teachers Association.

2. Necessary Conditions (all below must be met):

- A perceived need for additional teachers in that region must exist as determined by the Regional MCTA members.
- First must be nominated to apply by a MCTA member within their region. This MCTA sponsor will provide a nominating letter of reference to the Regional Manager.
- Written application to the regional manager of the MCTA (see below listing).
- Assist MCTA teachers through a minimum of 2 cycles of the entire curriculum.
**Exceptions may be granted in some developing countries.
- Applicant must be in good standing in their professional association and meet the above criteria to be considered for acceptance for examination.
- Payment of a non-refundable application fee (once the application is accepted).

3. Applicant Examination scheduled and administered.

4. Successful examination: confers provisional membership into the MCTA for 2 years with full membership granted with all rights and responsibilities pending a Regional Manager's review after the provisional period.

5. Examination failure: requires a minimum waiting period of 1 year to reapply.
